#### Full Return of Students - October 31, 2021

As you all are aware by now, all students must physically return to school no later than October 31. This amazing news comes on the heels of the announcement of His Highness Sheikh Mohamed Bin Zayed Al Nahyan that the UAE has overcome the COVID-19 crisis. As of October 31, students may not join classes as hybrid or online learners. Every student must join their classes in the school. Students who belong to the exempted categories may continue to join their classes online. However, the parents of those students must provide the school with attested doctors' letters explaining that they belong to one of the exempted groups.

To facilitate the rejoining of all the students gradually, we have already informed the parents of KG through Grade 4 students that their children may rejoin as of Sunday, October 17th. Students in the other grades are encouraged to join the school before October 31st. Students of Grades 5-8 may rejoin any time this week. Students of Grades 9-12 may rejoin as of Monday, October 25th.

#### **PCR Requirements**

Students who are 12 years of age or older and who have not yet joined the school (were online since the beginning of the school year) need to provide the school with a negative PCR test result on the first day that they enter the school physically. The PCR result should be printed and not on a mobile phone. Your classes are ready to welcome you.

### **Student Support as Schools Reopen**

As schools re-open, several challenges had to be addressed. Failure to address these challenges may have had a negative impact, not only on students' current education and development but also on their future careers.

Offering different learning modes such as F2F learning and online learning (for exempted groups only) will continue to help students catch up on lost learning during the previous pandemic period.



Supporting students' socio-emotional wellbeing has specific relevance and can help to ensure that students return to school, catch up on lost learning, and adapt to new circumstances.

It is essential to support students' ability to regulate their emotions and to help them cope with unexpected and difficult situations. Similarly, supporting students' self-efficacy may help boost their confidence in their ability to catch up on lost learning, which may help them re-engage with learning. This support should be given by teachers and, where possible, parents to help a smooth total return of students back to school after October 31st as required by SPEA.

The partnership between home and school is vital for students' progress and wellbeing, so we encourage more parent involvement in their children's education. Please check all school communications for information regarding the weekly plan, assignments and assessments, projects, and school events for parents and for the students.

The primary modes of communication for our school are Class Dojo for school-wide communications and KG/ES Grades 1-4. The MS and HS sections also have Grade level What's App Groups. In addition to these ways to communicate, scheduled parent meetings, student progress notes, MS Teams posts, telephone calls, and emails are ways to stay connected to SAIS Shj. We are readily available to support you and your children.

# **EMSAT FAQs**

CAT 4: CAT 4 testing will take place on October 26th for Grade 5 and October 27th for Grade 9.

CAT 4 is a diagnostic assessment that is designed to help students and their teachers understand how they learn and what their academic potential might be. It assesses how students think in areas that are known to make a difference to learning.

PIRLS test, an international assessment administered every five years that measures trends in reading comprehension at the fourth grade, but this year will be done for fifth grade.

PIRLS focuses on three aspects of reading literacy:

- purposes of reading
- processes of comprehension; and
- reading behaviors and attitudes

**MAP**: MAP testing will take place from November 1- 14 for all Grade 3-9 classes. We will share the schedule and pertinent information very soon.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### What is MAP?

MAP stands for Measures of Academic Progress. MAP is an online assessment that is aligned to the Common Core standards.

#### What is different about MAP?

These computerized tests are adaptive and offered in Reading, Language Usage, Science, and Mathematics. When taking a MAP test, the difficulty of each question is based on how well a student answers all of the previous questions. As the student answers correctly, questions become more difficult. If the student answers incorrectly, the questions become easier. In an optimal test, a student answers approximately half the items correctly and half incorrectly. The final score is an estimate of the student's achievement level.

#### How long does it take to complete a test?

Although the tests are not timed, it usually takes students about one hour to complete each MAP test. MAP for Primary Grades tests take from 20 to 30 minutes to complete.

#### How often will my child be tested?

Students will be ideally test in Fall, Winter, and Spring.

#### What are MAP tests used for?

MAP assessments are used to measure each student's progress or growth in school. Parents may have a chart in their home that marks their child's height at certain times, such as on his or her birthday. This is a growth chart. It shows how much he or she has grown from one year to the next. MAP assessments do the same sort of thing, except they measure each child's growth in

mathematics, reading, and language usage. The scale used to measure each child's progress is called a RIT scale (Rasch unIT), which is an equal interval scale much like feet and inches on a yardstick. It is used to chart each child's academic growth from year to year.

#### How will the school use the test scores?

MAP tests are important to teachers because they keep track of progress and growth in basic skills. The test scores let teachers know where a student's strengths are OR if help might be needed in any specific areas. Teachers use this information to help guide individual and group instruction in the classroom.

#### A RECIPE FOR SUCCESS

- Faith: Have faith in pursuing your dreams and make sure to evaluate your progress every now and then.
- **Fun:** Enjoy the moments in your life.


